Open Service Board Position Descriptions

Service Board Fund Development Committee Chair

Lead efforts to raise awareness of the “Service Center” about our tradition of self-supporting through: Group Donations, Literature Donations and Events

- a. Raise awareness about our financial support model for AFG of Southeastern Wisconsin, Inc.
- b. Create additional pipeline of qualified fund development where appropriate and ensure that any method of donation is as simple as possible.
- c. Ensure the method of receiving funds and forms of payment are current with the market.
- d. In conjunction with the Treasurer, manage the ecommerce aspect of funding.
- e. In conjunction with the Finance committee, help advise with the development of an annual budget in support of the financial needs of the organization.
- f. In conjunction with the Group Outreach and Community Outreach committees, support their efforts.
- g. Ensure the ongoing health of the Snow Ball.
- h. Develop sub-committees in support of committee work, especially Events.
- i. Fill in as Service Board Officer if needed.
- j. Write an article for the website twice annually.

Requirements

- Windows Operating systems. Not sure if Mac users would be compatible. We would need to verify.
- Commitment of ~1-2 hours per month. Depending on the number of webmasters, the rotation is 1 week every 3-4 weeks. Week runs Wednesday thru Tuesday. Any emails coming in during that week are their responsibility. If we need to trade (vacation, etc), we ask the group.

Proficiencies

- File Explorer. Webmasters use a similar program (**free** FTP - file transfer program) to move files to and from the website.
- Notepad ++ (**free**) or Notepad (**free**). They are very similar. We use it to edit HTML, used to create many of the more static documents on the website. HTML is text with some format markings. No knowledge of HTML is needed, as the instructions will provide what to do. Typically, we help each other when we need to update these and we do not need to very often.
- Word. Either Microsoft Office or WPS Office works to edit the Secretary Corner. WPS Office has a **free** version. It puts a watermark when you print.
- PDF. Documents such as Secretary Corner and Volunteer Calendar, are printed to a PDF file, a format that all users can read. It simply requires printing to a PDF file rather than to a printer. A PDF print option may be already on the computer or **free** downloads are available.
- Adding events to the Events page is done using a custom application. A template is completed with all pertinent information.
